• Sikkim Introduces India's First Sabbatical Leave Scheme for Govt Employees Sikkim has become the first state in India to launch a Sabbatical Leave Scheme for government employees, providing them with opportunities for personal and professional growth while retaining job security. Introduced in August 2023, the scheme allows regular employees with 5+ years of service can take 365–1,080 days off with 50% basic pay while retaining seniority, and the government may recall them with one month's notice. Even temporary employees with 6 months' service are eligible, making the scheme progressive and inclusive.

BIMSTEC Traditional Music Festival Debuts in New Delhi

The <u>first-ever BIMSTEC Traditional Music Festival</u>, 'SaptaSur: Seven Nations, One Melody', held <u>at Bharat Mandapam</u>, New <u>Delhi</u>, the event will feature artists from all seven BIMSTEC nations—India, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Myanmar, Nepal, Sri Lanka, and Thailand—celebrating unity in diversity through music.

Pariksha Pe Charcha (PPC) Sets Guinness World Record
