



The Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) is a national level entrance test. It offers admission to undergraduate (UG) and postgraduate (PG) law programmes for 24 National Law Universities in India.

The Consortium of National Law Universities and comprised representative universities conducts CLAT. The CLAT test is also used by a number of affiliated colleges and companies for recruiting and admissions, respectively. The CLAT is used for all admissions to the five-year integrated LL.B. and LL.M. programmes that start in the academic year.

# ELIGIBILITY FOR THE UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME

Educational Qualification: In terms of the required minimum percentage of marks in the qualifying test (10+2 or an equivalent exam), the students need to have obtained:

- \* 45% marks or the equivalent grade is required for General, OBC, PWD, NRI, PIO, and OCI applicants
- \* 40% marks or the equivalent is required for applicants falling under the SC/ST categories

**Nationality:** Applicants must be Indian or NRIs/NRIsponsored.

**Age Limitation:** There is no upper age limit for UG Programme in CLAT 2025.

**Other Criteria:** Candidates who previously been had a criminal record, or engaged in academic dishonesty are not eligible to apply to any law school through CLAT.



#### **CLAT Exam Pattern:**

There are 120 multiple-choice questions in the CLAT test, and duration is for two hours. For every correct answer, candidates receive one mark; for every incorrect answer, they lose 0.25 marks. English Language, Current Affairs, Legal Reasoning, Logical Reasoning, and Quantitative Techniques are the five categories from which test questions are drawn.

#### **CLAT Syllabus:**

As we have discussed the CLAT exam pattern which includes English Language, Current Affairs, Legal Reasoning, Logical Reasoning, and Quantitative Techniques. These are included to make CLAT syllabus. There are grammar, comprehension, and vocabulary questions in the English language part. While questions on legal notions and concepts are included in the Legal Reasoning part, questions about national and international events are included in the Current Affairs area. The Quantitative Techniques portion contains questions on mathematics and numerical aptitude, the Logical Reasoning component assesses the candidates' capacity for analysis and problem-solving in complicated scenarios.

Be Familiar with the Syllabus: Understanding the syllabus and test format is the first step in preparing for the CLAT. This will assist you in making appropriate preparatory plans.

Conclusion:

The Common University Entrance Test (CUET) has been introduced by the Ministry of Education for admission to Undergraduate Programs across all Central Universities in the educational year 2022-23. CUET is conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA), established in 2017 to oversee admission exams for higher education institutions with an objective to put into effect the "one India, one exam" vision. This initiative offers a unified platform and equal opportunities for applicants nationwide, especially those from rural and remote areas, nurturing stronger connections with universities. CUET permits applicants to discover a various subjects and streamline the admission process for different Central Universities through a single examination. CUET was formerly known as the Central Universities Common Entrance Test (CUCET), the name was changed by the University Grants Commission (UGC).

#### **CUET LLB Syllabus 2024**

The four components of the CUET LLB 2024 syllabus include computer fundamentals, general knowledge/awareness, English comprehension, and general aptitude and logical thinking. This corresponds to the NTA-mandated curriculum for the COQP11 papers, or general papers, which is also the CUET LLB code.

#### **CUET LLB Exam Pattern**

The CUET PG LLB question paper follows Pattern 3 which is prescribed by NTA for general papers. As per the prescribed CUET LLB 2024 exam pattern, there will be a total of 100 MCQ questions spread across four sections namely language comprehension, general awareness, computer basics and general aptitude and logical reasoning. Each correct answer would fetch 4 marks while each incorrect answer will attract a penalty of 1 mark.

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The Government of India implemented a Common University Entrance Test (CUET) for all UG admissions including LLB in the entire nation's institutions, with a motive to revolutionize higher education in the country. Candidates who have qualified the CUET LLB entrance exam are eligible to apply for various reputed universities in India such as BHU, JNU, AMU, DU, etc. depending on the CUET LLB marks and eligibility criteria of the selected university. If you are the willing to participate in the CUET examination then it becomes important to know the details mentioned above.
